




PROGRESS OF REFORM MATRIX (2018 – 2022)



- Started implementing a roadmap for digitizing Government payments (National Aid Fund and Health)
- Launch of Customs' National Single Window automating all trade related procedures

- Adoption of the National Quality Policy and Action Plan (by Q2 2021)
- Expand e-payments to all Government entities (by end of 2020)
- Comprehensive review and amendments to Investment Law based on international best practices (by end of 2020)








Achieved

- Initiated multiyear expansion of NAF's cash transfer program to cover at least 85,000 additional households over (2019-2021). To date 45,000 number of beneficiaries received cash transfer
- Approved a targeting mechanism for delivering electricity support benefits that will help in providing social protection to the poor
- Roll out of digital payment to all NAF's takaful cash transfer beneficiaries
- Launched a new Social Protection Strategy (2019 2025)

- Achieving the target of additional 85,000 household beneficiaries from Takaful Program (by 2021)
- NUR becomes the single gateway to all Jordanians who are seeking social assistance (by 2021)

45,000 households enrolled in Takaful

Expansion of the cash transfer program and improving the delivery system

- Launched the expansion of NAF through the Takaful Cash Transfer Program (targeting 85,000 households by 2021)
- Launched the data exchange platform National Unified Registry (NUR)
 - Launch of the National Social Protection Strategy that includes NAF expansion and NUR
 - A new takaful cash transfer program launched benefiting from national unified registry

- 55,000 households enrolled in Takaful
- 15 government institutions connected to the NUR data exchange platform

 Emergency cash transfer response program to COVID-19 launched benefiting more than 200k households




IMPROVE PUBLIC TRANSPORT EFFICIENCY AND ACCESS



Achieved

- Licensing of ride hailing applications such as Uber
- Update the Public Transportation Code of Conduct for zero tolerance to gender harassment to regulate the passenger, driver, and operator code of conduct in public transport

 Revise public transport regulation to cover prohibition of gender harassment; adopt Code of Conduct for zero tolerance to gender harassment; and establish an effective Grievance Redress Mechanism (by end of 2020)

IMPROVE PUBLIC TRANSPORT EFFICIENCY AND ACCESS



Enhance Women's Mobility towards Economic Empowerment

- Code of Conduct issued by the Ministry of Transport in 2019 specific to the public transportation system to regulate behaviour of drivers, operators, and passengers with clear rules against gender-based discrimination and sexual harassment
 - Amended instructions for licensing and permitting of operators to require operators to sign and commit to adhere to the code of conduct and enforce penalties on violators



Solar to the Poor Initiative

- This Initiative lies through the provision of renewable energy to the poor and vulnerable households through allocating JD 7 million from GoJ's budget
- Beneficiaries: Families currently eligible for social assistance under the National Aid Fund

 Initiated 'Solar to the Poor' Initiative through Fils-al Reef to install 2 kWH solar photovoltaic systems

Issuance of 11 tenders to install additional 3,316 PV systems by end of 2020 Installed **2,224 PV** systems since the beginning of the Initiative

Installed **2,073 PV** systems since the beginning of 2020




PROMOTE WATER SECURITY AND AGRIBUSINESS

Achieved

- Implementation of the Water Security Strategy and accompanying Investment and Financing Plan to optimize and prioritize sector investments
- Designed Water Savings Program to reduce non-revenue water reduction

- Launch communication campaign to improve communication around water allocation and strategy (by 2021)
- Implement measures to reduce fiscal losses in water sector (by 2020 – 2021)
- Two competitiveness reinforcement initiatives in agriculture (by end of 2020)

PROMOTE WATER SECURITY AND AGRIBUSINESS



Competitiveness Reinforcement Initiatives (CRI)

- A value chain deep dive approach that develops competitive clusters of market players and service providers through an inclusive public private dialogue approach
- The model focusses on the Connectedness (improved logistics, reduced trade restrictions and trade in logistics services), the Capabilities (new skills, new technologies, increased digital readiness) and Competitiveness (new business models and increased productivity)
- · CRI team within MoPIC.
- Initiated work on two CRIs in Agriculture currently underway (Middle Jordan Valley and Mafraq)






