Reforms Catalysts

COUNCIL OF MINISTERS APPROVED THE UPDATED REFORM MATRIX

In October 2022, the Council of Ministers approved the Reform Matrix (2018-2024). The updated Matrix was expanded to 12 pillars instead of 9, with three new pillars added; Public Sector Efficiency and Governance, and Tourism, while separating the original water and agriculture pillar into two pillars. Under the new Pillars now there are 44 reform areas, and 389 reform actions. To date, around 50% of these reform actions were achieved.

It is worth mentioning that the updated Reform Matrix is strongly linked with the Economic Modernization Vision, as it directly addresses many of the key sectors and initiatives that fall under the Vision with 30 initiatives taken directly from the Reform Matrix.

The Reform Secretariat has identified key priority areas from the Reform Matrix to focus its support on through the Jordan Growth Multi Donor Trust Fund (MDTF), this includes: 1) Public procurement; 2) Investment promotion; 3) Business environment; 4) Trade facilitation; 5) Good Regulatory Practices; and 6) Tourism sector.

Next Steps

The following are the key next steps that the Reform Secretariat is planning to accomplish during the next phase:

- Establish coordination working groups with both GoJ implementing agencies and international development agencies operating in the fields related to the above mentioned identified priority reform areas, with the aim of aligning resources and efforts towards achieving targeted national goals.
- Continue providing the needed technical and capacity building support to the GoJ ministries and entities through the Jordan Growth Multi-Donor Trust Fund (MDTF)
- Finalize the progress report covering the achieved reforms during 2022.
- Maintain and enhance the alignment of the Reform Matrix and the MDTF activities with the Economic Modernization Vision.
